ABOUT GREGORY THE GREAT

Commemoration: March 12

A sixth-century Pope and Doctor of the Church, Gregory was consecrated Bishop of Rome in 590 and served until his death in 604.

Gregory is remembered for sending Augustine to Canterbury in 597 to do missionary work among the Anglo-Saxons. Gregory's book, Pastoral Care (c. 591), is one of the classics of pastoral theology and sets out his view of the bishop as the shepherd of souls.

Self-described as a "servant of God's servants," Gregory is one of only two popes to be given the title, "the Great," and is one of the four great Doctors of the Western Church. (Adapted from Episcopalchurch.org)
