ABOUT THE ANNUNCIATION OF OUR LORD

Feast Day: March 25 9 am: Holy Eucharist

The Feast of the Annunciation commemorates the announcement by the angel Gabriel to Mary that she would be the mother of God's Son, Jesus, and Mary's assent in faith to God's invitation (Luke 1:26-38). It symbolizes the Incarnation, God becoming one of us in order to save humanity. It is estimated that this Feast Day was celebrated as early as the fourth or fifth century.
