ABOUT JOHN DONNE

Commemoration: March 31

Priest and poet John Donne was born in 1572 in London and ordained in 1615, after which he served as royal chaplain to King James I. Known as a distinguished "metaphysical poet" in English literature, his sonnets and sermons are among his most notable publications. The Hymnal 1982 features two of his hymns: "Wilt thou forgive that sin, where I begun" (140, 141), and "When Jesus died to save us" (322). (Adapted from Episcopalchurch.org)
