OCTOBER VESTRY MEETING HIGHLIGHTS – The Vestry met on Oct. 15 for their regular monthly meeting. Below are some highlights of other actions taken this month.

- A lengthy conversation about the emotional life cycle of a disaster, using resources from Episcopal Relief and Development, making space for folks to share their experience of these weeks following the hurricane and future hopes.
- Heard updates related to Annual Giving and the Audit of 2023 Financials.
- Approved allocations from the Outreach Committee responding to Hurricane Helene. Knowing that the response to this disaster is only beginning and will be long, the Outreach Committee recommended, and the Vestry approved, allocations of \$3000 to Episcopal Relief and Development and \$2000 to Wine to Water for recovery efforts in WNC.
