- Father Andrew will continue leading us in conversation in the Barrett Room on The Epistle to the Hebrews. This New Testament Letter, less frequently read and even less frequently explored in depth, forms and informs much of the early Church's understanding of who Jesus is and what the Church is called to be. Over the next several weeks in the Rector's Forum, we will take a closer look at this formative letter and how it informs our lives as disciples today.
